

PPO VIOLATIONS/SHOW CAUSE HEARINGS

Arraignments for Lock-up Violators

- * Set bond, set trial date
- * House Counsel must speak with any respondents that are being held in the Sheriff's Department on the 17th floor prior to the arraignment
- * Petitioners presence is not necessary for arraignment
- *

Arraignments for Petitioner-filed Violators

- * set bond, set trial date
- * House Counsel must speak with the respondents concerning the allegations and any possible plea offers
- * Petitioners presence is not necessary for arraignment
- *

Show Cause Hearings

- * Penalty is up to 93 days in jail and/or a \$500 fine
- * Sentence is usually immediate upon a finding of guilty
- * Pending criminal charges (adjourn PPO show cause until after adjudication of pending criminal charge in another court)
- * House Counsel represents the respondent(s) in the Show Cause Hearing
- *

Review Hearings

- * usually after a Plea Under Advisement to determine compliance

Other Information:

- * Neither the prosecutor nor the House Counsel represent the parties for Petitions to obtain PPOs or Motions to Terminate, Extend, or Modify the PPO
